Partial Funding of an onsite, online or hybrid Cologne Summer School 2024

Application deadline: January 31st, 2024

Within the framework of the "Cologne Summer Schools" project, the Division International Affairs of the University of Cologne uses funding from Santander Universities to support international Summer School projects that are planned and implemented under the leadership of a department, institute, chair or research group of the University of Cologne. External research institutions or third parties may be involved, but they must have a partnership with the University of Cologne or the unit organizing the Summer School.

Since 2020, in addition to projects that take place on-site in Cologne or abroad, we have also supported online Summer Schools that are realized in virtual space or in a hybrid context. Cologne Summer Schools provides partial funding for onsite/ online/hybrid projects for which you can submit an application.

Who can submit an application?

Employees of all faculties, departments, institutes, etc. of the University of Cologne who would like to establish or have already established an international Cologne Summer School.

We are supporting Summer School projects that will take place **between May and October 2024** in one of the formats listed below.

Below you will find more information on eligibility criteria, application and processing.

Project Funding Criteria

1. Format

Onsite: In this format, your project takes place on-site at the UoC OR on-site at a partner university. Eligible costs are mobility, academic and cultural program costs.

Online: In this format, your project takes place exclusively in the digital space. In this context, funding is available not only for academic program costs but also for a digital cultural program, such a s virtual museum visits, online city tours, and networking activities.

Hybrid: In this format, your project takes place simultaneously on-site and online. The academic program is designed and conducted in a hybrid format, i.e. there are mostly synchronous teaching and program units with the online and on-site groups. The selection of participants into the on-site and online groups is determined by the project director(s). Eligible costs include mobility, academic

program, and cultural program costs, which may include both onsite and digital program components.

2. Participants of the program: International students and students of the UoC. The group should consist exclusively or at least half of international students. In order to comply with the idea and format of a Summer School, in general **the number of participants should not be less than 15** (excluding lecturers and organizational team).

3. Study level: Priority at least students on an advanced bachelor's level, master and doctoral students.

4. Interdisciplinary concepts are given priority.

5. The academic teaching program is to be carried out predominantly by lecturers from the University of Cologne; practical teaching components (project work, workshops, study trips, excursions, laboratory units, empirical research) must be an integral part and should comprise at least one third of the total working hours.

6. Cultural program: In addition to subject-related content, an onsite or online cultural program must be offered to provide participants with information about the University of Cologne and local study or doctoral opportunities, as well as about German culture.

7. Duration of a Summer School: At least 5 consecutive days.

Target Group and Eligible Costs

CSS provides funding exclusively for costs related to the participation of international and Cologne students or doctoral candidates in a Summer School. **Eligible are**

- **primarily** costs for mobility grants, e.g. travel costs on a pro rata basis* (airfare, especially to support students from the Global South, with special needs) or within the School (local transport, transportation costs such as train or bus rides in the context of an excursion), accommodation costs.
- costs for a cultural and social program, e.g. museum admission, city tour, digital events, hospitality at welcome and farewell events (excluding alcoholic beverages, service and deposit fees) and
- costs for the academic program, e.g. honoraria exclusively for external lecturers or site visits.

*for orientation cf. the DAAD's flat rates

Please note:

During the new CSS project period from 2024 to 2026, neither costs for the project leader(s) nor the organizational team are eligible. ^{Generally,} funding for institutional units is not eligible. CSS approves **partial funding** for Summer School projects only.

Application

Please read carefully the application form below and provide your information only in this form. The Division International Affairs does not specify a maximum funding amount. Depending on the total volume of applications, the available budget is distributed among the approved project applications. The Cologne Summer Schools team (Dept. 93 International Mobility) decides on the funding of the applications.

By accepting the grant, you agree to:

- Managing autonomously the project finances with D6 and submit a financial report to CSS, Dept. 93. Instructions will follow along with the letter of approval.
- Providing comprehensive information about your Cologne Summer School on one of your websites announcing the abstract, program, application criteria and application deadline. Your project website will be linked to the Cologne Summer Schools website: www.colognesummerschools.uni-koeln.de.
- Providing a report and participants' testimonials in English as well as photos for the purpose of external presentation and reporting. Detailed information will follow in the letter of approval.

Only applications that are complete and submitted by the deadline can be considered.
